

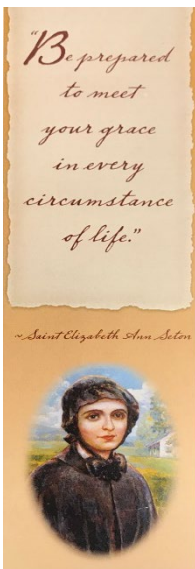


United in Prayer for Vocations | November 2022

A monthly prayer service is being prepared by each branch in our Federation. The purpose is to pray for vocations, to help us learn a bit more about the charisms of each of our congregations, keep us engaged collaboratively in vocation ministry and bring us closer to seeing ourselves sharing a common Mission of Charity for the present and the future.

Introduction to the beginnings of the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill



The opening passage of the original rule adopted in 1812 by St. Elizabeth Seton reveals the single motivation and the universal mission which inspired St. Vincent de Paul: “The principal end for which God has called and assembled the Sisters of Charity is to honour Jesus Christ our Lord as the source and model of all Charity by rendering Him every temporal spiritual service in their power in the Persons of the poor, either sick, invalid, children, prisoners, even the insane, or others who thro’ shame would conceal their necessities.” (Original Rule, 1812).

The [Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill](#) received its lasting name by unanimous approval when the sisters journeyed from Altoona, Pennsylvania, where they began in 1870, to the large farm Mother Aloysia Lowe had purchased in 1882 situated on a hilltop in the town of Greensburg. The view was breathtaking, the air was fresh and clean, unlike the intense pollution of the industries and trainyards that made up Altoona. To name the hill, Seton Hill, was so easy considering the clear skies overhead that Elizabeth Seton would have cherished.

A school was begun at the cathedral nearby. An academy was initiated at Seton Hill. A Junior College was established, and finally in 1918, Seton Hill received its four-year college charter and status and, later, university status in 2002. The community answered Pope John XXIII’s call for congregations to consider opening a mission beyond their home borders. Four sisters were sent to South Korea in 1960. After becoming a province, the Korean sisters responded to invitations to begin a mission in China and Ecuador. Through the past 152 years, Elizabeth’s words continue to echo forth:



“Be prepared to meet your grace in every circumstance of life.”

Call to Prayer: “We must pray without ceasing in every occurrence and employment of our lives – that prayer which is rather a habit of lifting up the heart to God as in a constant communication with Him.” (Elizabeth Ann Seton)

Reading: As she came to her last days, Elizabeth expressed what it meant to her to be a daughter of the Church:

From now on, no hesitation, no weakness, no procrastination. Holy Church of God, teach, direct self, call to yourself your child, docile and faithful forever more. Be children of the Church. Be children of the Church.” *(with pronoun liberties)*
